8:00	Settle Hotel charges on Wednesday evening. Bring your suitcase to the Novotel lobby at 8:00 (before breakfast).
9:00	<p>Bus leaves from Novotel! Thursday 3rd July: Glasgow 09:00 Depart Edinburgh and drive to Glasgow for a panoramic city tour incl. Glasgow Cathedral and the Burrell Collection.
