Following this pattern, the 2007 issues will enter public domain at the end of 2011. Current issues of the Journal are reserved to WACRA members in good standing. The Board is currently considering to move all Journal issues to the public domain.

The new **WACRA Publication Partnership Project - W3P** responds to member interest to develop WACRA-based partnerships that focus on producing high quality manuscripts suitable for IJCRA publication. To help facilitate W3P, WACRA is establishing a database so that lead authors (individuals seeking partners) and secondary co-authors (individuals willing to work with and support lead authors) can find each other. For your **promotion and tenure applications (P&T)**, you should know that Cabell lists IJCRA in its Directory of Publishing Opportunities in Management. Cabell is the largest citation index and directory of academic journals in the U.S.A. University administrators (deans, department chairs) in the U.S.A. and in other countries will consider for P&T decisions a faculty publication in a journal listed by Cabell.

If you have or are planning to retire from your faculty position, continuing your WACRA membership affords you the

opportunity to mentor those who are at the beginning of their academic careers. By staying active and connected, you can continue to travel the world and maintain your sense of well-being .

All WACRA activities, including IJCRA, are financed through membership dues and program revenues. Stockholm, Sweden

Stockholm is the capital and the largest city of Sweden and constitutes the most populated urban area in Scandinavia. It is the site of the national Swedish government, the Riksdag (parliament), and the official residence of the Swedish monarch as well as the prime minister. Founded possibly as early as 1187, Stockholm has long been one of Sweden's cultural, media, political, and economic centres. Its strategic location on 14 islands on the south-central east coast of Sweden at the mouth of Lake Mälaren, by the Stockholm archipelago, has been historically important. It is sometimes referred to as Venice of the North.

Stockholm's core of the present Old Town (Gamla Stan) was built on the central island next to Helgeandsholmen from the mid-13th century onward. The city originally rose to prominence as a result of the Baltic trade of the Hanseatic League. Stockholm developed strong economic and cultural linkages with Lübeck, Hamburg, Gdańsk, Visby, Reval, and Riga during this time.

The 17th century saw Sweden grow into a major European power. In 1710 a plague killed about 20,000 (36 percent) of the population. After the end of the Great Northern War the city stagnated. By the second half of the 19th century, Stockholm had regained its leading economic role. New industries emerged and Stockholm was transformed into an important trade and service centre as well as a key gateway point within Sweden. The 19th century saw the establishment of a number of scientific institutes, including the Karolinska Institute. Stockholm became a modern, technologically advanced, and ethnically diverse city in the latter half of the 20th century. [Source: Wikipedia]

Karolinska Institute

Karolinska Institute is one of the world's leading medical universities. Its mission is to contribute to the improvement of human health through research and education. Karolinska accounts for over 40 per cent of the medical academic research conducted in Sweden and offers the country's broadest range of education in medicine and health sciences.

Since 1901 the Nobel Assembly at Karolinska has selected the Nobel laureates in Physiology or Medicine. Karolinska was founded by King Karl XIII in 1810 as an "academy for the training of skilled army surgeons". Today, Karolinska Institute is a modern medical university and one of the foremost in the world. With its close relationship to the clinical milieu, a well established infrastructure and a stable financial situation. Karolinska Institute is one of the five Swedish University cooperating in WACRA 2012 at The Royal Technical Institute (KTH).

Fjäderholmarna

Friday, June 29, 2012 - optional dinner (separate registration)

This island is one of the most exciting places to visit in Stockholm. Here the archipelago begins before leaving the pulse of the city. Appreciate Swedish handicraft, enjoy one of the many cosy restaurants.

The archipelago extends from Stockholm roughly 60 kilometers to the east. There are approximately 30,000 islands and islets. The shipping routes from the Baltic to Stockholm pass through the archipelago. There are three main entrances suitable for deep-draught craft, namely, those near Landsort, Sandhamn, and Söderarm.

The landscape has been shaped by land elevation. The islands rise by about five millimeters each year. In 1719 the archipelago had an estimated population of 2,900. Today the archipelago is a

popular holiday destination with some 50,000 holiday cottages (owned mainly by Stockholmers). The inhabitants in the



archipelago from around mid 1400 until the end of WW II were farmers and fishermen. After the war, the younger generation started to leave the archipelago and look for jobs in the cities on the main land.

Today most of the small farms on the islands are closed and the fish industry has almost disappeared.

Boating is an extremely popular activity with the sailing race Ornö runt (or Around the island of Ornö) being the largest in the archipelago. This race has taken place 35 years in a row. It is open to anyone with a sailingboat but requires registration. Visiting the larger islands in the archipelago is easy all year round, but during winter period the routes depend on the ice conditions. In the summertime the archipelago is bristling with private boats filled with people who often take advantage of Allemansrätt (or "everyman's right"), a law which gives anyone the right to go ashore or anchor on any ground not in the direct vicinity of buildings.

¿Necesita publicar su trabajo académico?

WACRA Publication Partnership Project (W3P)

The International Journal of Case Research and Application (Revista Internacional de Investigación y Aplicación de Casos) es la publicación oficial de WACRA y como tal aspira a publicar artículos de alta calidad, de todo el mundo, que capture la innovación y creatividad en el aprendizaje y en los métodos interactivos de enseñanza. El Proyecto WACRA de Publicación Asociada responde al interés de los miembros de desarrollar asociaciones basadas en WACRA enfocadas en producir artículos de alta calidad publicables en IJCRA. Para facilitar W3P, WACRA está estableciendo una base de datos para que autores principales (individuos que están buscando socios) y coautores (autores secundarios) (individuos que buscan trabajar y apoyar a los autores principales). Para construir esta base de datos, solicitamos a autores y coautores envíen lo siguiente:

Autores principales: elijan de su trabajo un artículo que tenga potencial para IJCRA. Esto podría ser un caso en desarrollo, un artículo sobre educación, etc. Envíe un resumen de 1/2 páginas a WACRA. El resumen debe incluir el propósito de su investigación, la metodología, los resultados (si es posible) y las conclusiones (si se han determinado). Por favor, incluya su nombre, su institución y afiliación de su departamento, su email, idioma nativo, y si prefiere un coautor dentro de su disciplina. Se alienta a los autores principales que envíen un ejemplo representativo de su nivel de inglés, que puede ser por escrito o en un video de 3 minutos donde hable acerca de su investigación.

Coautores: envíen un resumen de los tipos de socios con los cuales les gustaría colaborar. Esto puede incluir colegas en una específica disciplina, colegas que comparten un mismo enfoque de investigación, o colegas de alguna específica región del mundo. Los coautores deben estar disponibles de poner en correcto inglés las ideas o redacciones, ayudar a organizar los artículos de acuerdo a standards académicos aceptables, y ayudar a formatear el artículo según las guías de WACRA. Por favor, también incluyan 1/2 páginas de algún artículo publicado, un resumen de su propia investigación e interés en publicar, así como su nombre, institución, afiliación de su departamento y email.

Asociaciones: los coautores se contactarán con los autores principales con los cuales quieran trabajar y entre ambos decidirán si desean formar esta asociación. Cuando hayan formado una asociación los autores principales le informarán a WACRA, así se podrá quitar sus nombres de la base de datos. Los artículos W3P enviados a IJCRA serán tratados con la misma rigurosidad (doble revisión a ciegas) que los demás artículos.

An Afternoon 'Journey Through Swedish History'...

With the Conference Hosts

The 19th century was a period of great change throughout Europe and Sweden was no exception. Its rural way of life was rapidly giving way to an industrialised society and many feared that the country's many traditional customs and occupations may be lost to history.

Artur Hazelius, who had previously founded the Nordic Museum on the island of Djurgården near the centre of Stockholm, was inspired by the open-air museum founded by King Oscar II in Kristiania in 1881 when he created Skansen, his open-air museum on the hill that dominates the island.

Skansen is the first open air museum and zoo in Sweden and is located on the island Djurgården in Stockholm, Sweden. It was founded in 1891 by Hazelius (1833-1901) to show the way of life in the different parts of Sweden before the industrial era.

Skansen became the model for other early open-air museums in Scandinavia and later ones elsewhere. The name "Skansen" has also been used as a noun to refer to



other open-air museums and collections of historic structures in Central and Eastern Europe, but also in the U.S., e.g. Old World Wisconsin and Fairplay, Colorado.

Skansen was originally a part of the Nordic Museum, but became an independent organisation in 1963. The objects in the Skansen buildings are still the property of the Nordic Museum. After extensive traveling, Hazelius bought around 150 houses from all over the country (as well as one structure from Telemark in Norway) and had them shipped piece by piece to the museum, where they were rebuilt to provide a unique picture of traditional Sweden. Only three of the buildings in the museum are not original, and were painstakingly

copied from examples he had found. All of the buildings are open to visitors and show the full range of Swedish life from the Skogaholm Manor house built in 1680, to the 16th century Älvros farmhouses.

The open-air museum Skansen attracts more than 1.3 million visitors each year. The many exhibits over the 75 acre (300,000 m²) site include a full replica of an average 19th-century town, in which craftsmen in traditional dress such as tanners, shoemakers, silversmiths, bakers and glass-blowers demonstrate their skills in period surroundings. There is even a small patch growing tobacco used for the making of cigarettes. There is also an open-air zoo containing a wide range of Scandinavian animals including the bison, brown bear, moose, grey seal, lynx, otter, red fox, reindeer, wolf, and wolverine (as well as some non-Scandinavian animals due to their popularity).

In early December the site's central Bollnäs square is host to a popular Christmas market that has been held since 1903, attracting around 25,000 visitors each weekend. In the summer there are displays of folk dancing and concerts [Excerpts from Wikipedia].

The Thursday afternoon event (for registered conference delegates and partners) starts after lunch at the KTH Campus.

It includes a guided walking tour through the center of Stockholm (alternative: public transportation is available).

KTH students will lead a group-work exercise to discover the history of Sweden from an Economical point of view: starting out in the raw material industry, once upon a time, and ending up with companies like Ericsson, IKEA and Spotify. The day will end at the Skansen restaurant 'Soliden' which affords a wonderful view of Stockholm and the water archipelago.

WACRA Publication Partnership Project (W3P)

The International Journal of Case Research and Application (IJCRA) is the official publication of WACRA and as such aims to publish high-quality manuscripts that capture innovation and creativity in learning and interactive teaching methods globally. The WACRA Publication Partnership Project responds to member interest to develop WACRA-based partnerships that focus on producing high quality manuscripts suitable for IJCRA publication. To help facilitate W3P, WACRA is establishing a database so that lead authors (individuals seeking partners) and secondary co-authors (individuals willing to work with and support lead authors) can find each other.

To build the database, WACRA is asking lead authors and co-authors to submit the following:

Lead authors: Choose from your work an article that has IJCRA potential. This could be a case study under development, an article about innovation in teaching, etc. Submit a 1 - 2 page summary of the research to the WACRA database. The summary should include a section on each of the following: the purpose of the research, the methodology, the findings (if available), and the conclusions (if determined). Please also include your name, school and department affiliation, current email address, native language, and whether you prefer a co-author within your discipline. Lead authors are encouraged to post a representative example of their English-language usage. A lead author may also wish to upload a three minute video clip of himself in which he talks about: the topic of his research/case, the methodology, the findings, and the conclusions.

Co-authors. Submit a brief summary of the kinds of partners with whom you would like to collaborate. This may include colleagues in a specific discipline, colleagues who share a specific research focus, or colleagues from a specific region in the world. Co-authors should be willing to work with lead authors to put ideas into proper English, to help organize the paper according to accepted academic standards, and to help format the paper according to IJCRA guidelines. Please also include 1 – 2 pages from one of your published articles, a discussion of your own research and publication interests, and your name, school and department affiliation and current email address.

Partnership. Co-authors will contact lead authors with whom they are willing to work. Lead authors and co-authors will mutually decide if they want to form a partnership.

When you have formed a partnership, the lead author should inform WACRA so that the entry can be deleted from the database. W3P papers submitted to IJCRA will undergo the same rigorous, blind peer review as all other papers.
